

Dear Parents

Attendance: Project 97!

As you know, attendance at school is important. Whilst we appreciate that some absences are unavoidable, many are not. Research demonstrates the negative impact of absences of all kinds (sickness, appointments, holiday etc.) on children. They miss chunks of learning and as a result, can make less progress. Research also suggests that, in some cases, it can create poor attitudes in later years, where school attendance is not valued, resulting in truancy.



Overall, as a school, our attendance is above the national average; however, we are still keen to improve. With this in mind, we are having a real push on attendance next term.

In 2022/23 our Term 5 attendance was 96.61% and we'd like to beat it this year. We are aiming for 97%!

We will be rewarding children with 100% attendance each week by giving them a ticket for a **raffle** that will be held on the last day of Term 5 (23rd May 2024). One winner from each class will win an age appropriate prize, that classes will vote for, in the first week back after Easter.

Suggested prizes include vouchers from the following:



Raffle tickets will only be given for 100% attendance for the full week. This will not include children that are marked as late. Just a reminder that our doors close at 8.45am!

During Celebration Assembly each week, we will be tracking our overall attendance percentage and sharing with the school community.
